The future of dispute resolution in transnational commercial law: the future and success of transnational recognition of judgments, the growth and problems with international arbitration and the rise of transnational mediation.



Notification of accepted proposals will be made by May 31<sup>st</sup>. We have been offered the possibility to publish some of the papers in the *Uniform Law Review*.
